Russell and Trudi played a wonderful and uplifting selection of piano duets for us.

They played three of Brahms Hungarian Dances, (numbers VI, VII and VII), a full version of Mozart's Eine Kleine Nachtmusik, the Arrival of the Queen of Sheba by Handel and finished with most of the movements from Saint Saens Carnival of Animals. These are popular classical pieces which we often hear at least in part in media productions as well as in recordings but hearing them live, as the composers themselves intended and as they would have heard them, was a great treat. My favourite was the Carnival of Animals especially the complex and glorious duets of the Aquarium and the Swan movements which are so lyrically beautiful.

For an encore they played Percy Grainger's Country Gardens which was a wonderful finish to a bouncing and happy concert.
